## Del. Sports Lottery Commission Allows Casino Study

**DOVER**, Del. (AP)- Delaware's Sports and Video Lottery Commission has approved a study to see if there is a demand for more casinos.

At its Tuesday meeting, the commission said the study to determine if Delaware needs more than three casinos could be complete by mid-December. The General Assembly wanted the report by Oct. 15.

Gov. Jack Markell's legal counsel Michael Barlow said they want to know if the current three casinos "are fully saturated" or if "more people are going to come."

The report will indicate the effects of more casinos on existing casinos, horse racing and the state's economy and revenues.

North Delaware lawmakers have said they want a casino in Wilmington and House Majority Leader Peter Schwartzkopf wants an \$800 million gambling resort near Millsboro.
